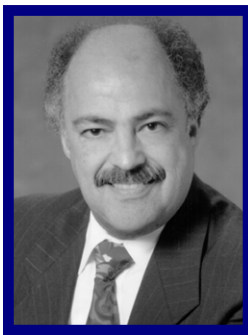
## Message From President Lion Mike Morgan

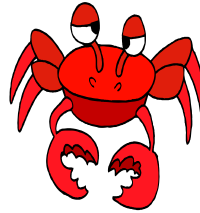
