On Saturday, June 4th, Saint Dunstan's School yard was awash with pancakes and pancake eaters as

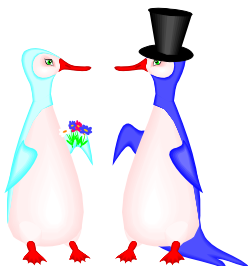

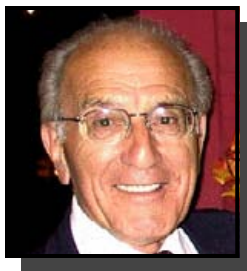

Dear Paul, Thought this might be a human interest story to put into the bulletin. It is a very poignant story and also shows the power of what a Canine Companion for Independence dog could have done for this brother of Lynn's. Thank you, Lion George

Dear George and Helen, You (George) asked me to e-mail you about my brother.

My brother Paul was born severely handicapped by cerebral palsy. He could neither talk nor walk or even sit up. But I won't say that he didn't communicate. He laughed when he was happy and cried when he was sad--but mostly he smiled. Since my mother worked the swing shift, my sister and I had to rush home from school each day to care for him. Therefore, my sister and I became shut-ins, as my brother required constant care. When I see the severely handicapped people, especially the children, and their families being handed their graduated canine companion, I can't help but wonder what our lives might have been like if we had been lucky enough to have such a dog in our family. Although it was very difficult growing up without experiencing a childhood, I try not to lose sight of the fact that at least I was always healthy and able-bodied.

At age 13 my brother died of complications of pneumonia secondary to his condition; I was 20 years old at that time.

So, if there is a way to dedicate my lifetime membership in the CCI, I would greatly appreciate it.

Kahului Lions Club, Maui, Hawaii

Twin Club of the Millbrae Lions Club

Our club just celebrated its 50th charter anniversary in 2003. As part of our anniversary, we were able to gather up some history about the club. This information not only increased the enjoyment of this important event, but also will help our newer members understand all that has come before.

Over the last 50 years, the Kahului Lions met in numerous places. I

do not have the exact chronology or the length of stay in any one location, but when the club was sponsored by the Haleakala Lions Club back in 1953, the initial meetings were held at the Maui County Golf Course Club House where the mother club had their meetings.

We later made the move towards Kahului about the time "Dream City" was being developed. I believe we met at the original Tokyo Tei Restaurant, located at the time makai of the Kahului Railroad track that ran through the

main street (now Kaahumanu Avenue). The spot was approximately the area between Hoaloha Park and the First Hawaiian Bank.

One of the earlier fund-raisers was the selling of brooms made by the blind on Oahu. The club bought several dozen of these brooms annually and the members re-sold them going house to house in the community. Many clubs in the district took on this project to help with the rehabilitation of the blind. For some reason,

the clubs discontinued the project after several years. The calendar project was abandoned to be replaced by the BBQ chicken fund raiser. The chicken project was replaced by our present cookie sale fund raiser.




There are, in addition, several current projects that originated many years ago. The annual Picnic for the Blind, the collection and processing of discarded eye glasses to be recycled and sent to places that can use them, and the Salvation Army Christmas Kettle watch during the holidays are among them. We also have the annual Zone Golf Tournament fund raiser, initiated by the Kahului Lions.

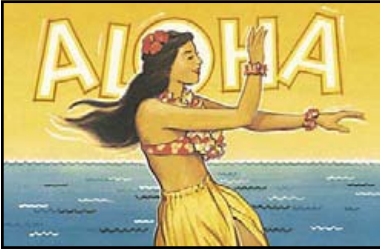

TO REMEMBER that in building up my business it is not necessary to tear down others. To be loyal to my clients or customers and true to myself.

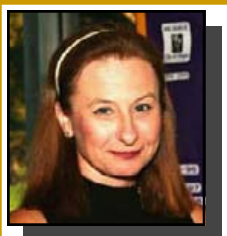
WHENEVER a doubt arises as the right or ethics of my position of action towards my fellow man, to resolve such doubt against myself.
