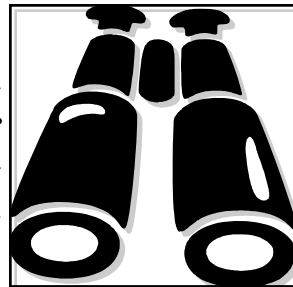

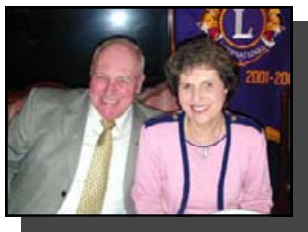

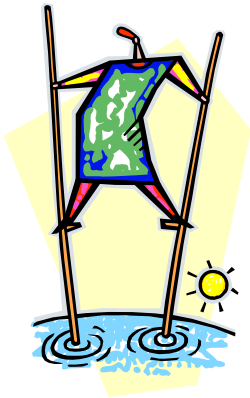
Twisted Tails

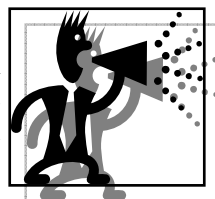
