You have heard how strongly Liza and Calvin believe in being a part of their children's lives, but their passion went beyond just their own family. They included all those children who touched the lives of **their children. And that's** how they came to be involved with the Millbrae Lions Club. Our club charters cub scout pack 355 and the amazing hard working Leos club. Naturally both Liza and Calvin would become involved in Cub Scouts and Leos. Liza and Calvin opened their home time after time, providing leadership and support to an extended family of young people far beyond their own. They led by example, teach-

ing the value of service and community not just with words but with their actions. Liza was an inspiration to the Millbrae Leos, who honored her courageous fight by raising \$20,000 for the American Cancer Society.

And by golly, she was there, radiant and smiling. They danced and he sang to her, **he sang "My Girl" and it** was a beautiful magic moment. Liza made magic happen for so many others, and I know her spirit lives on in the hearts of hundreds of Leos, Lions, Scouts, Neighbors, Friends and of course family. We will all treasure our time with her.

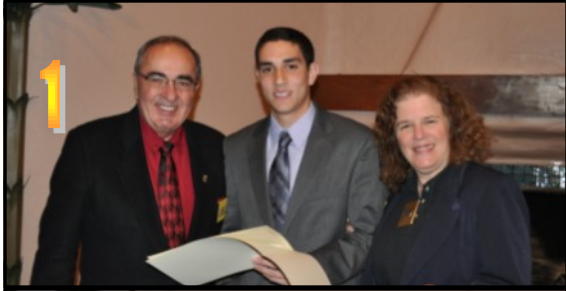
