BASO Lion Honored by Millbrae Historical Society

Bay Area Special Olympics (BASO) Lions Club member Helen Habeeb was honored at the Millbrae Historical Society Board of Directors installation, with the "Living History Award". "The Living History award is given to members who have demonstrated dedication relevant to the goals and objectives of the Society; and, these contributions will help perpetuate the history of Millbrae.



Lion Helen has received the ninth (9) "Living History Award" in the forty-one year history of the Millbrae Historical Society's existence. Lion Helen worked in obtain-

ing a charter for the Millbrae Historical Society in 1970. Lion Helen campaigned to save the 16 Mile House, a historical landmark built by the first Spanish settlers, the Jose Sanchez family. When the fight was lost, Lion Helen helped to promote another house. It was an abandoned house formerly located at 1275

B r o a d w a y , Millbrae, which was built in 1898 by the Spring Valley Water to house personnel, which later became the San Francisco Water Department. In 1985, Lion

Helen was involved in the move of the Spring Valley Water Company house, known today as the Millbrae Historical Society Museum.
