## Message from the President

The Millbrae Lions Club has been serving our community for 73 years, or 10 years longer than the City of Millbrae. Our 70 members range in age from 31 to 93 and come from a wide variety of occupational backgrounds, from truck drivers to corporate executives and from doctors to undertakers. The Millbrae Lions are like a neighborhood -- the old fashioned kind -- where you take care of not just your job and family, but also your friends and neighbors.

On September 10 and 11 of 2010 the Millbrae Lions reached across town borders to help our neighbors in San Bruno, a town staggered by a horrific gas explosion. We served over 700 meals to displaced residents, families, friends, Red Cross volunteers, firefighters, insurance companies, public officials and news media. Lions from across the district came to work side-by-side as many generous food donations poured in. We continue to volunteer in San Bruno, helping to sort and pack donations for the victims, and on two Glenview neighborhood gatherings.

In the last two months we've been working on a project to renovate the former Lions Scout House on Taylor

Middle School property. This unique and beautiful building is in the perfect location for a youth center, potentially providing a wide variety of after school programs. In a separate article you will read how local groups are working to turn that vision into a reality, but I touch upon it here because of the surreal feeling of those three work days with Lions and many others working side by side.

If you recall the movie "Witness," there is a scene where the whole town gathers to build a barn, gentlemen with hammers and ladies with picnic baskets. They construct the frame on the ground, and then standing shoulder to shoulder raise it high in the air, where the most agile hang and fasten cross beams to hold the section vertical, while their neighbors hold the sections steady down on the ground. We didn't have a full orchestra playing inspirational music like the movie, but it almost felt that way. It felt like a group of good friends working side by side to do something bigger and more meaningful together. That's the way it feels to be a Millbrae Lion. I am very proud of our club.

during Youth Week. This year local schools, from 4th grade up through High School, received a flyer listing the Essay Contest rules, along with specific topics to write about. The topics for this year were:

- Describe a person in your life (family, school, community) whom you admire and why.*
- Describe an animal that changed your life and how.*
- Describe a new class you would like to see offered at your school and why.*
- Describe a situation where peer pressure exists and how to deal with it effectively in a positive way.*
- Describe how an act of kindness changed your life.*

There were scores of essays that were turned in to the judge Robert Silva, and among those there were 6 students authors that stood out among the rest.

As Chairman of the Student Essay Contest it is my duty to contact the winners. They were all so excited when I told them that they won and would be receiving an award at a dinner especially for them, it makes the preparation and time put into the Essay Contest all worth it. Each student was invited to bring their parents and their teacher to the Awards Dinner.

On the evening of the Youth Week Awards Dinner, a semi-formal event held at the El Rancho Inn "Palm Room", the Millbrae Lions honored those students for not only writing special essays, but for also being very special themselves!

That year we bestowed a special honor upon Robert Silva as the first ever recipient, and this year we continued in that spirit by honoring another special individual who's had a positive impact on the lives of our Millbrae students. Earlier this year EXCELLENCE IN MENTORING AWARD Nomination Forms were distributed to the schools giving the community the opportunity to choose special nominees and write up to 300 words on why they should be selected to receive this prestigious honor. Each submitted nomination form was reviewed and selected in confidentiality. The final decision was difficult since each nominee had unique and deserving qualities, but based on the submitted criteria it was obvious that one special person stood out.

In brief: The 2011 EXCELLENCE IN MENTORING AWARD, which is also known as the EDUCATOR OF THE YEAR AWARD, is honoring a well known Taylor Middle School teacher. This 6th and 7th grade math teacher is known for carefully planning and executing rigorous lessons to students in her classes. 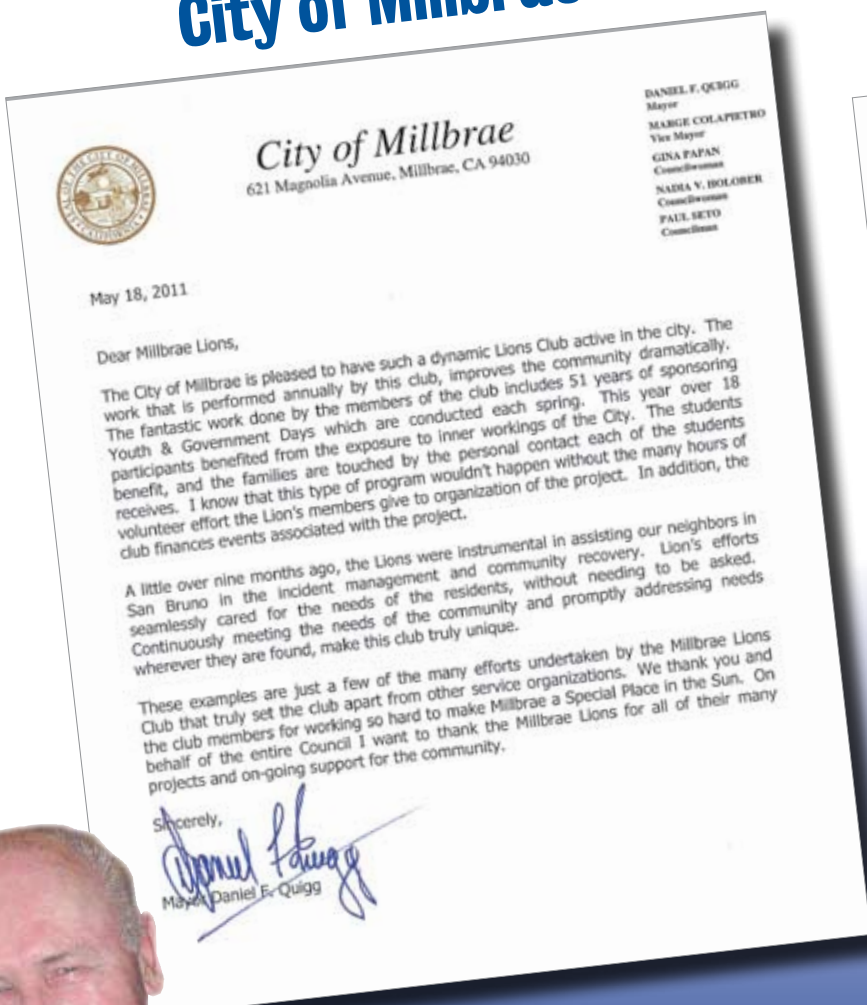

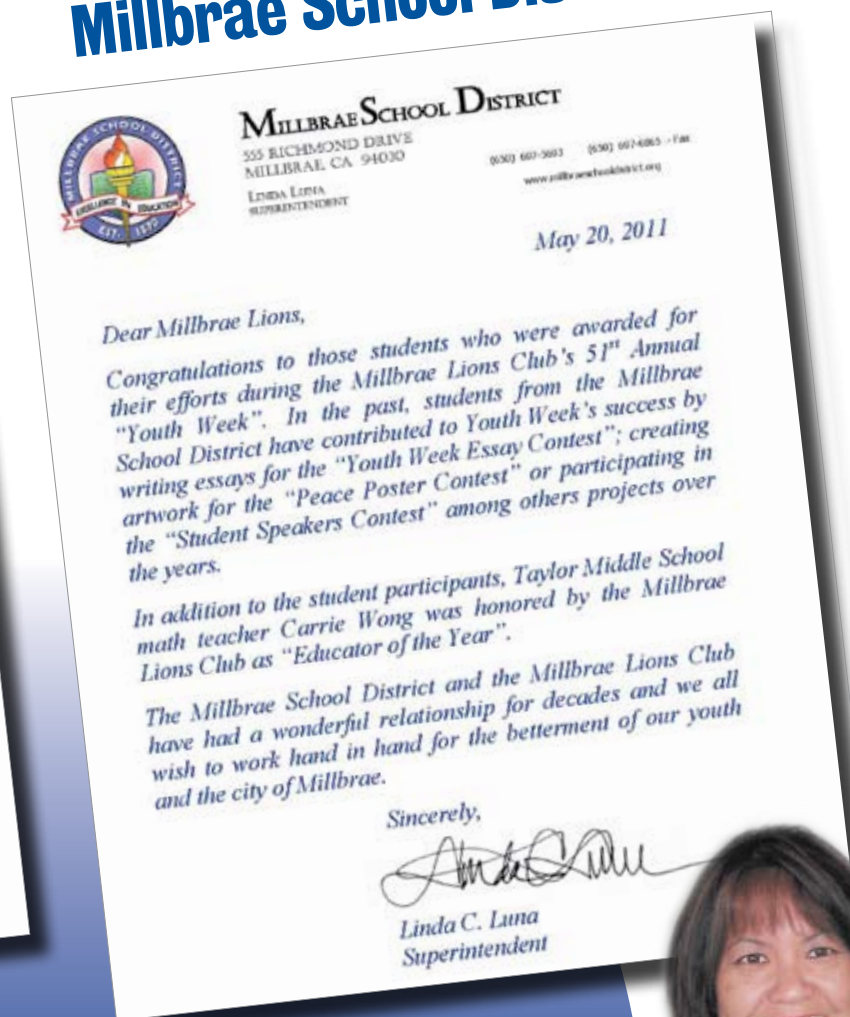

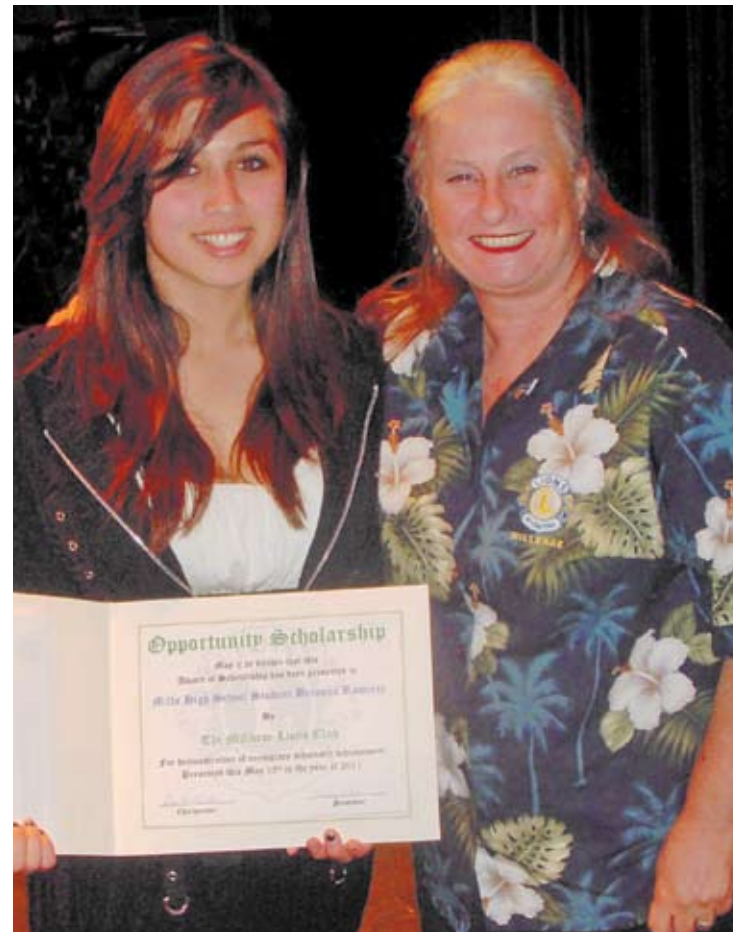

# The MLC Family Assistance Program

## Opportunity Scholarship and Mills High School Girl Graduate of the Year and Boy Graduate of the Year Awards

It has been my distinct pleasure and honor over the past several years to chair the Family Assistance Program and some of our youth projects, specifically, the Opportunity Scholarship Awards and the Mills High School Graduates of the Year Awards (in conjunction with Burlingame Lions Club).

It has been a challenge to reach the truly needy in our community, so in recent years I have hitched our wagon to the Samaritan House, though which our club is able to cast a wider net to help not only people in need in Millbrae but throughout San Mateo County. With the help of the Samaritan House, we were able to supply toiletries and towels to the Safe Harbor Shelter, which has provided beds to the homeless since 1987. In August we provided backpacks filled with all the essentials for children in

need to start the school year out on the right foot. We also issued a challenge to all the rest of the District 4-C4 Lions Clubs to try or better our 20-backpack donations (and indeed one club did outdo us with their donation of 25 backpacks). Our December campaign also provided toys and canned and dried goods to the needy during the holidays.

Our Opportunity Scholarship Program provides two one-year scholarships each year to a graduating senior at both Capuchino and Mills High School. The scholarship provides a kick start to the awardees for their first year of college. Applicants for the scholarship are expected to provide a personal statement as to their career goals.

The yearly highlight of the Mills High School Senior Awards Night is the Graduates of the Year Awards. Each year the Millbrae Lions Club, in conjunction with the Burlingame Lions Club, award this prestigious honor to a graduating young

woman and a graduating young man. The much coveted prize winners are selected by a special committee from Mills High School. So special is this award that the committee members are sworn to secrecy and only approximately two weeks before the awards night am I told the names of the winners (I recall a couple of years ago while making my way to the podium to present the Millbrae Lions Club award at least one teacher was begging me to tell her the name of that year's winners before I made the announcement on stage—myself also having been sworn to secrecy, I simply could not betray that trust). The winners are each awarded a plaque and \$200 donated by MLC and BLC and their names are engraved on a progressive plaque displayed in the career center in perpetuity. This year's award winners are Alexander Marie E. Madarang (award presented by the MLC) and Julian Zhuning Xie (award presented by the BLC).

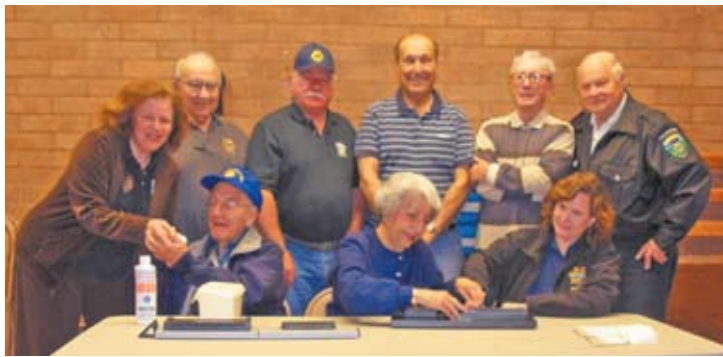

## Millbrae Community

### Joins Forces in Rebuilding Lions Scout House for Youth Center

If you are over the age of 20 and have either played Lions Baseball or been involved in Scouting, you know all about the marvelous log cabin behind Taylor Middle School "A"-wing. You might have attended a Crossover Ceremony, when Webelos become Boy Scouts. You might have attended a sleepover or a Lions event there. If you've been around a bit longer you might remember that there used to be a fire pit inside. It's all coming back to you, yes?

The Scout House was built by the Lions Club back in 1954 -- and when I say built by the Lions Club, I mean bulldozers, hammers, concrete and \$16,000 of materials. But it has been vacant and unused for years. So the Millbrae Lions approached the City of Millbrae and the Millbrae Elementary School District (MESD) with an offer to gift the building to the City for public use. The three parties met, and forged an agreement, whereby the Lions and other community groups would have two years to raise money to upgrade the building for ADA compliance, new seismic requirements and basic repairs.

Community support for the project has been heartwarming. The project is supported by all major service groups -- really an amazing list of partners (I tried to list them all below, but if I have forgotten anyone, I apologize!). And we've achieved a stunning transformation of the building -- new landscaping, entry ramp, ADA compliant bathrooms, carpeting, paint, electrical upgrades, furniture and much more.
